Kendall Seal is Vice President of Research & Policy and General Counsel for the Women's Foundation. At the Women's Foundation, he provides legal counsel and oversees the organization's public policy strategy, philanthropic administration, and research. Seal has over a decade of experience working in law, politics, and public service on the national, state, and local levels. Prior to joining the Women's Foundation, Seal spent six years as a litigator in southern and western Missouri.

In 2013, Governor Jay Nixon appointed Seal to the

governing board of the Missouri State University system for a six-year term; and in 2014, at the request of Senator Claire McCaskill, Seal was appointed to the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights-Missouri State Advisory Committee where he studied civil rights concerns and policing practices for two years.

Originally from Piedmont, Missouri, Seal earned his bachelor's degree in political science, magna cum laude, from Missouri State University. During undergraduate studies, Seal studied French in Québec. He earned his juris doctorate degree from the University of Missouri-Kansas City School of Law where he serves as an adjunct law professor.
