Visiting Lecture and Discussion

Prof. Ed Galindo (Yaqui, American Indian) and faculty member at the University of Idaho and Associate Director for Education and Diversity for the NASA Idaho Space Grant Consortium. Dr. Galindo has extensive education and research in working with Native American students. While serving as chairman of the science department on the Shoshone-Bannock Indian Reservation, he was twice elected as the National Indian Teacher of the Year. Dr. Galindo will talk about his long-term collaboration with the Shoshone-Bannock Tribe on the conservation of beavers in their traditional territory. His talk will explore how universities can collaborate with tribal communities in meeting their research interests.
