


# Payroll Protection Program (PPP) in Kansas

The Paycheck Protection Program, administered by the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA), is a loan program designed for small businesses to retain workers during the COVID-19 pandemic. The SBA will forgive loans if employee retention criteria are met and funds are used for eligible expenses. Loans that are not fully forgiven have an interest rate of 1%, payments are deferred for six months, and mature in 2 years (loans made before June 5th) or 5 years (loans made after June 5th). **51,873 Kansas Small Businesses received PPP Loans as of June 30, 2020. These loans are intended to retain 521,322 Kansas jobs.**


**Percent of Small Businesses in Kansas Receiving PPP Loans, by County, as of June 30, 2020**
