Student codes of conduct, online training, and bystander programs are a good start, but...

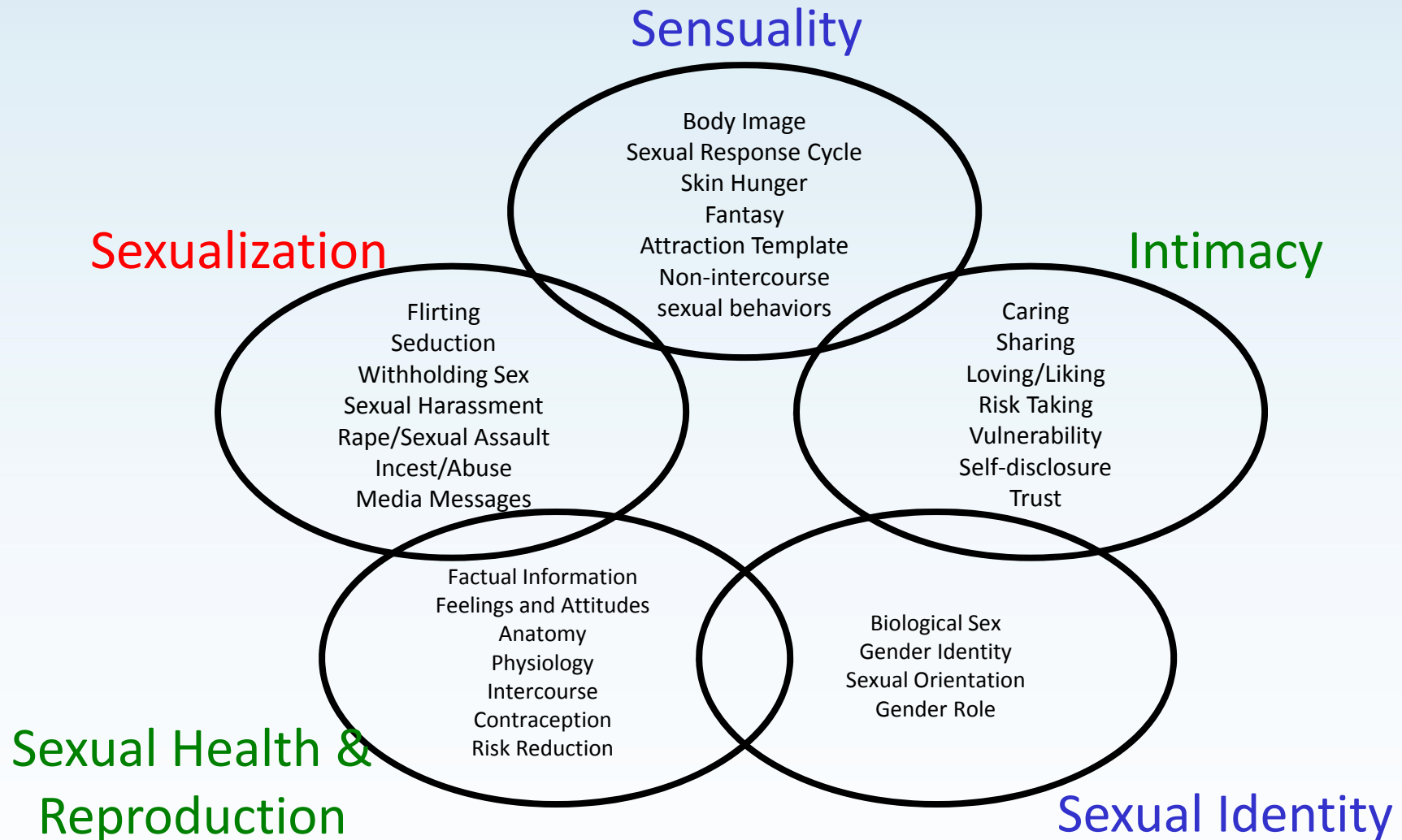
We **cannot** assume students have had sexuality education prior to coming to campus.

Health Promotion

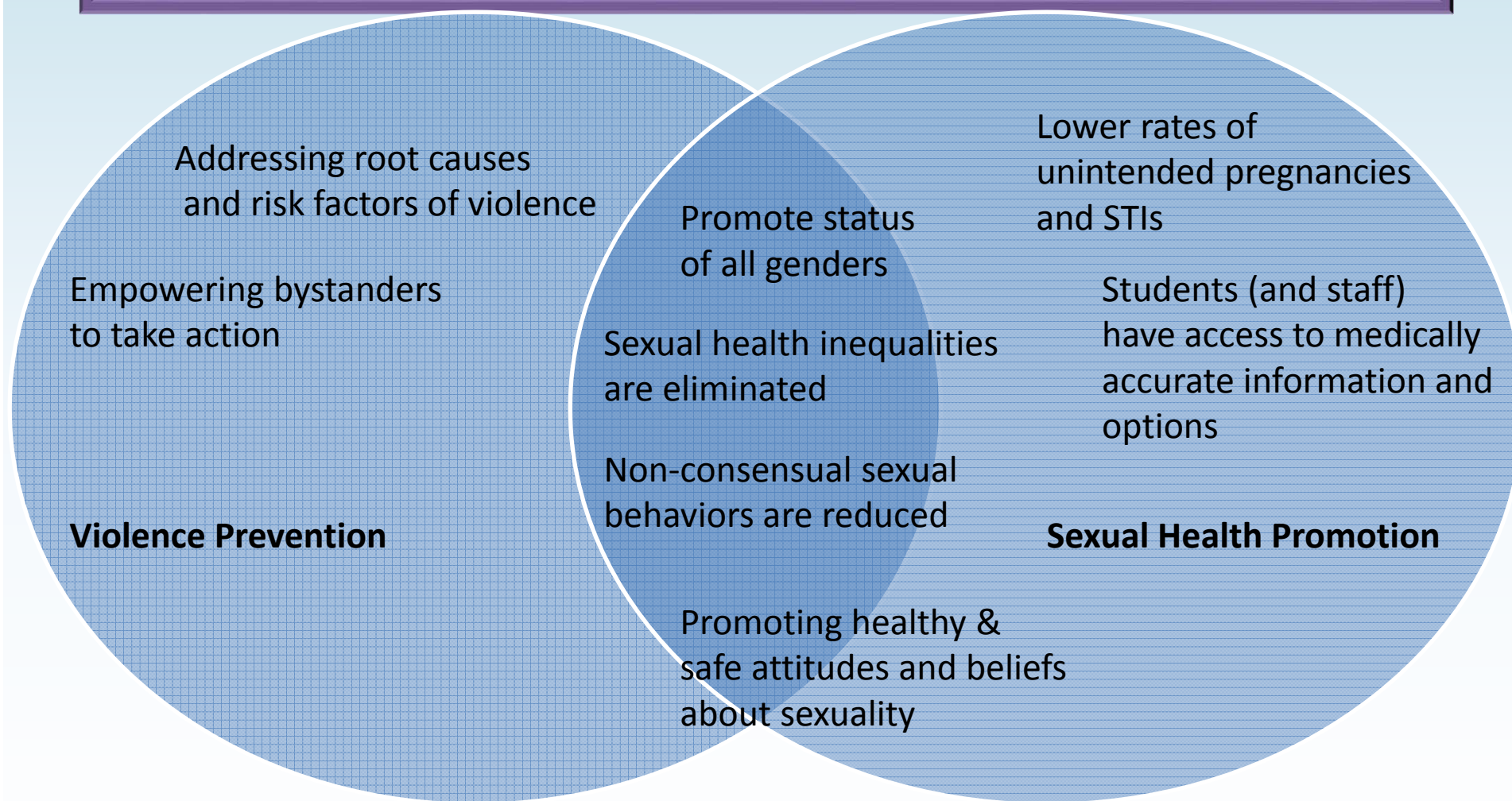
Promoting healthy sexuality =

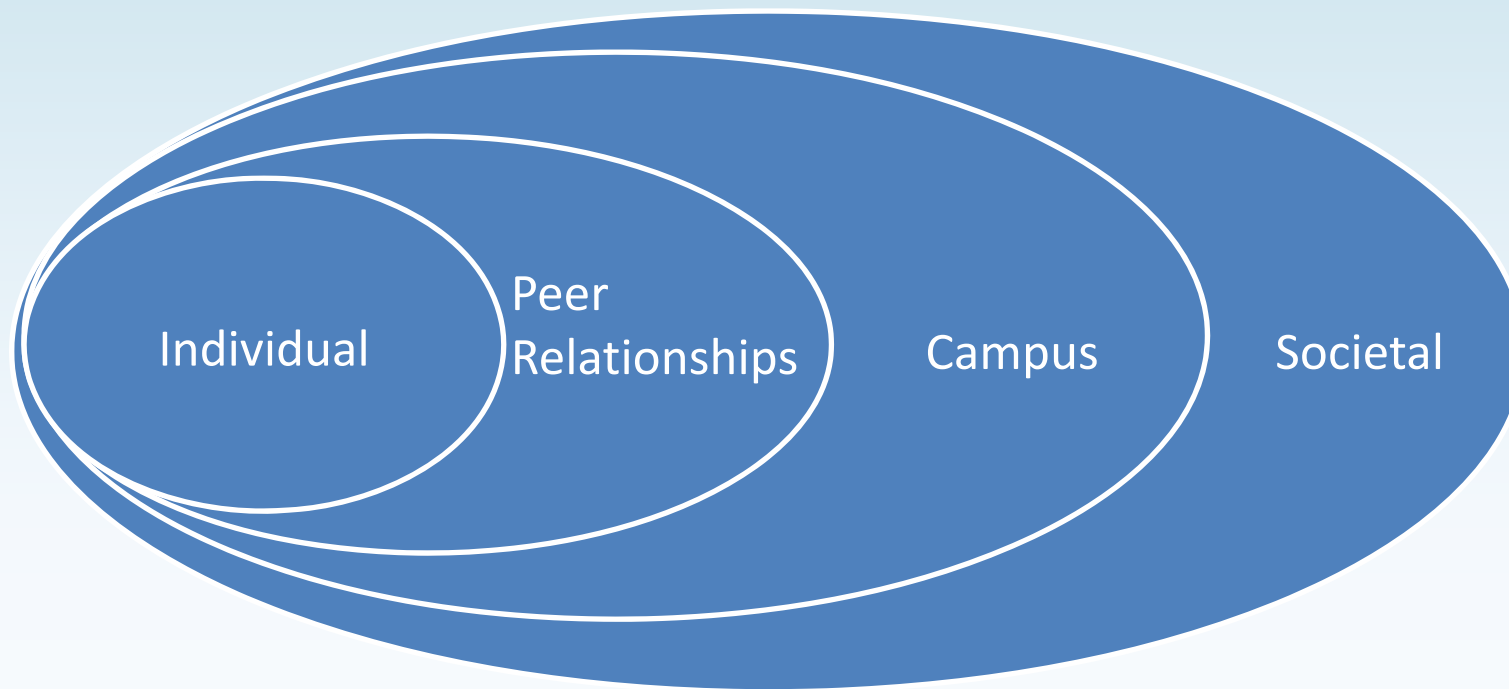


What's the role for faculty & staff?
