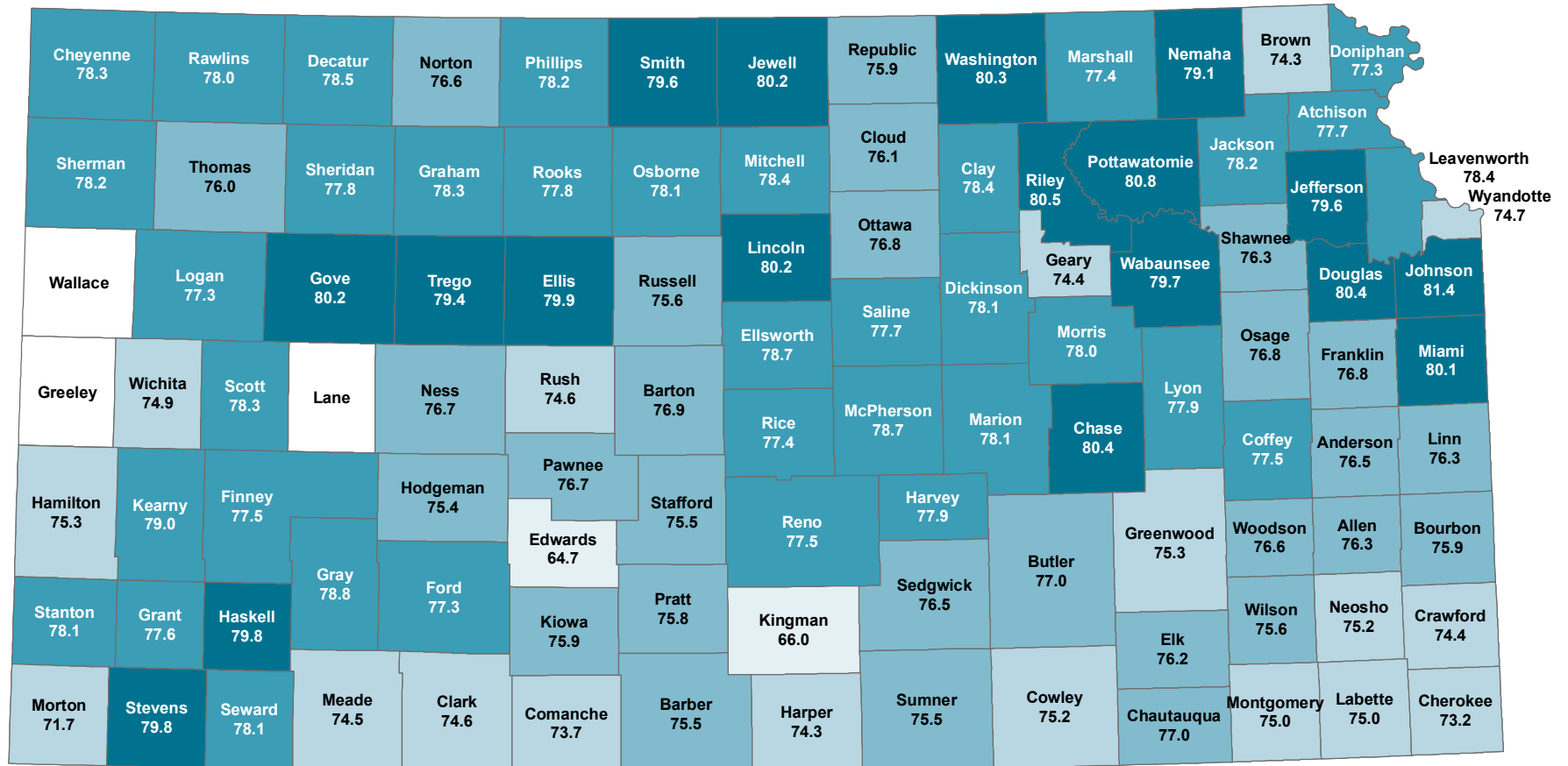




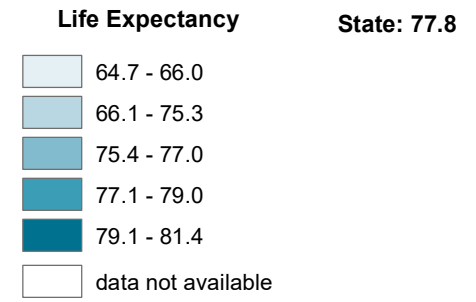

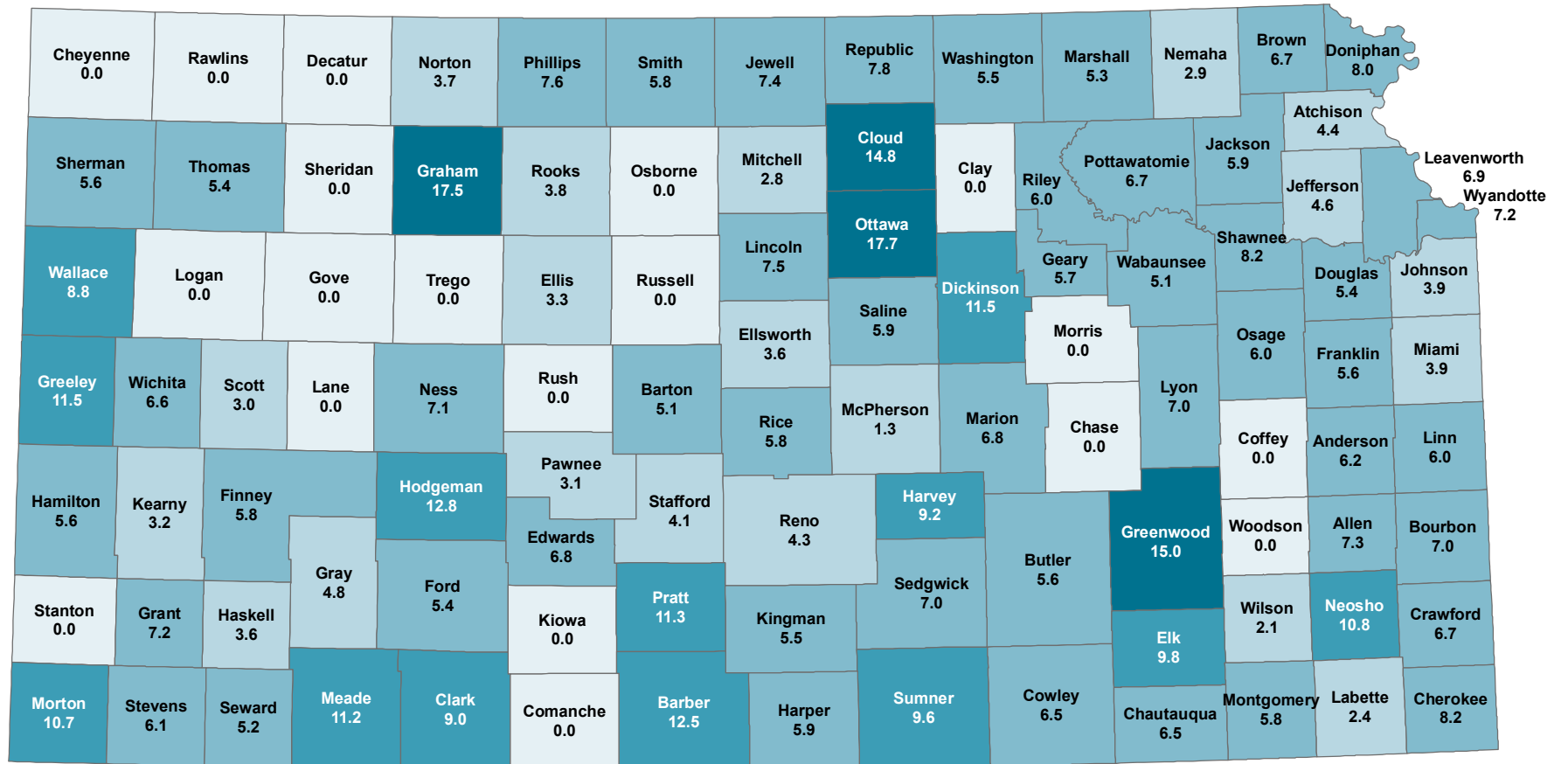
Life Expectancy at Birth in Kansas, by County, 2018-20

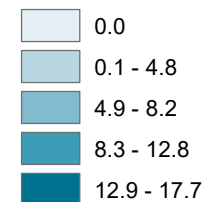
Infant Mortality Rates in Kansas, by County, 2017-21



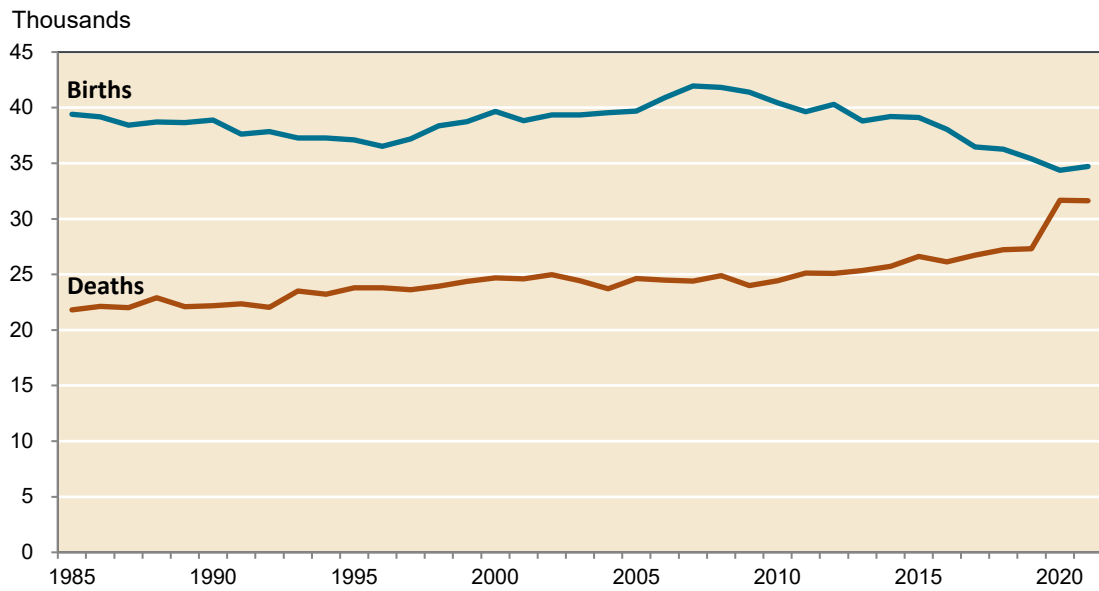

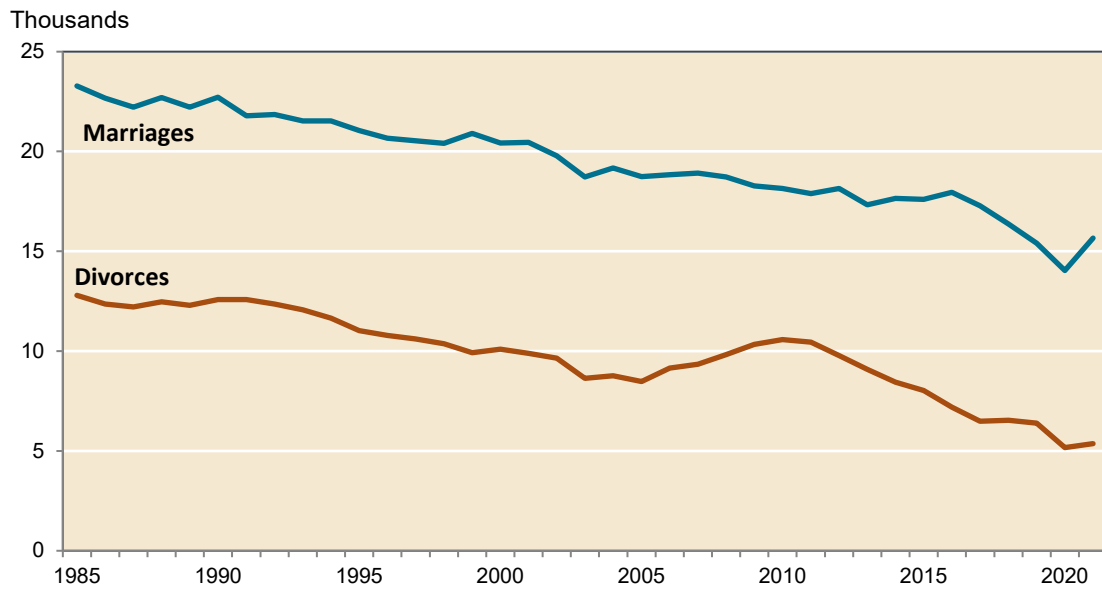

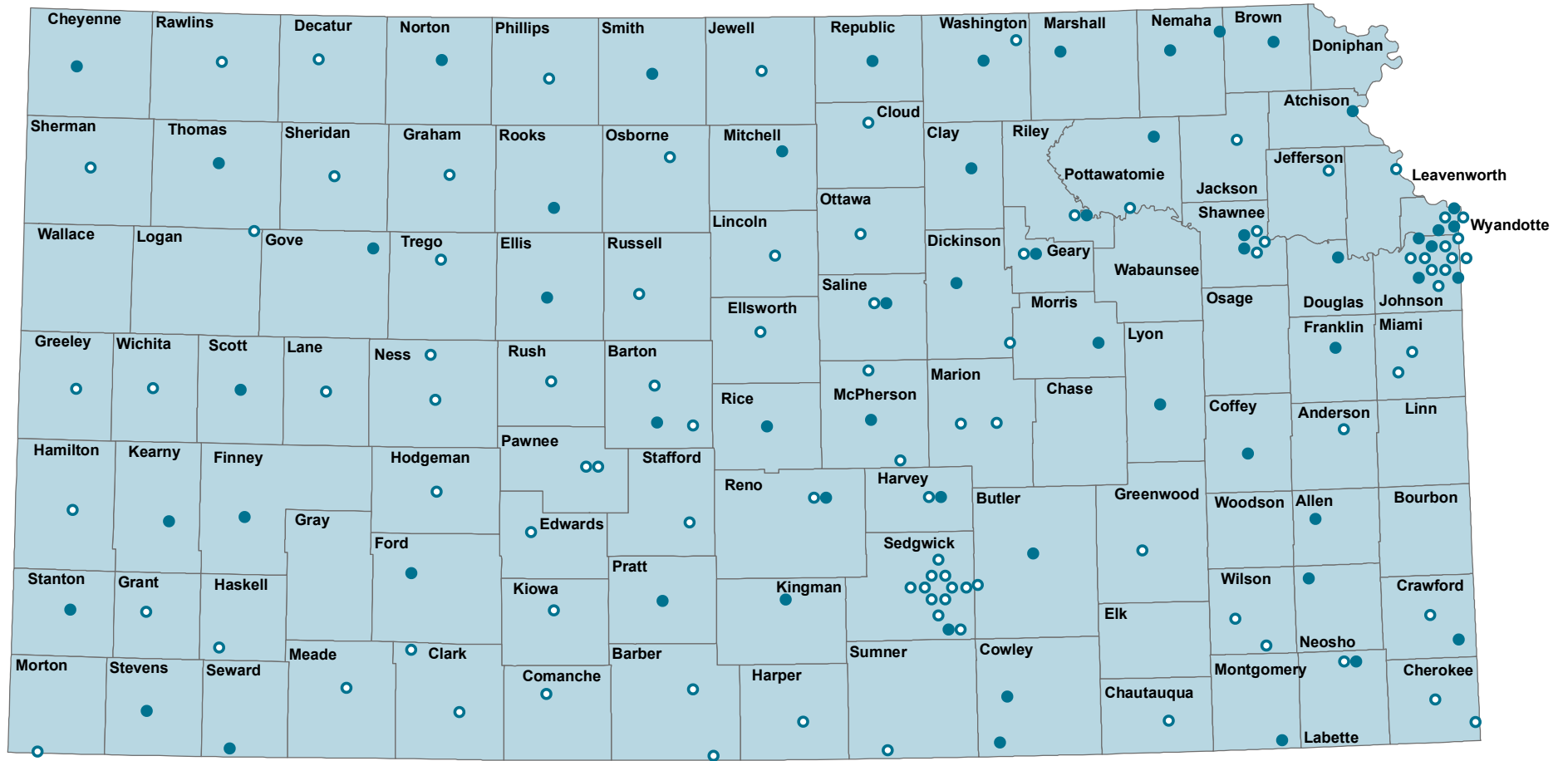

Hospitals in Kansas, 2021



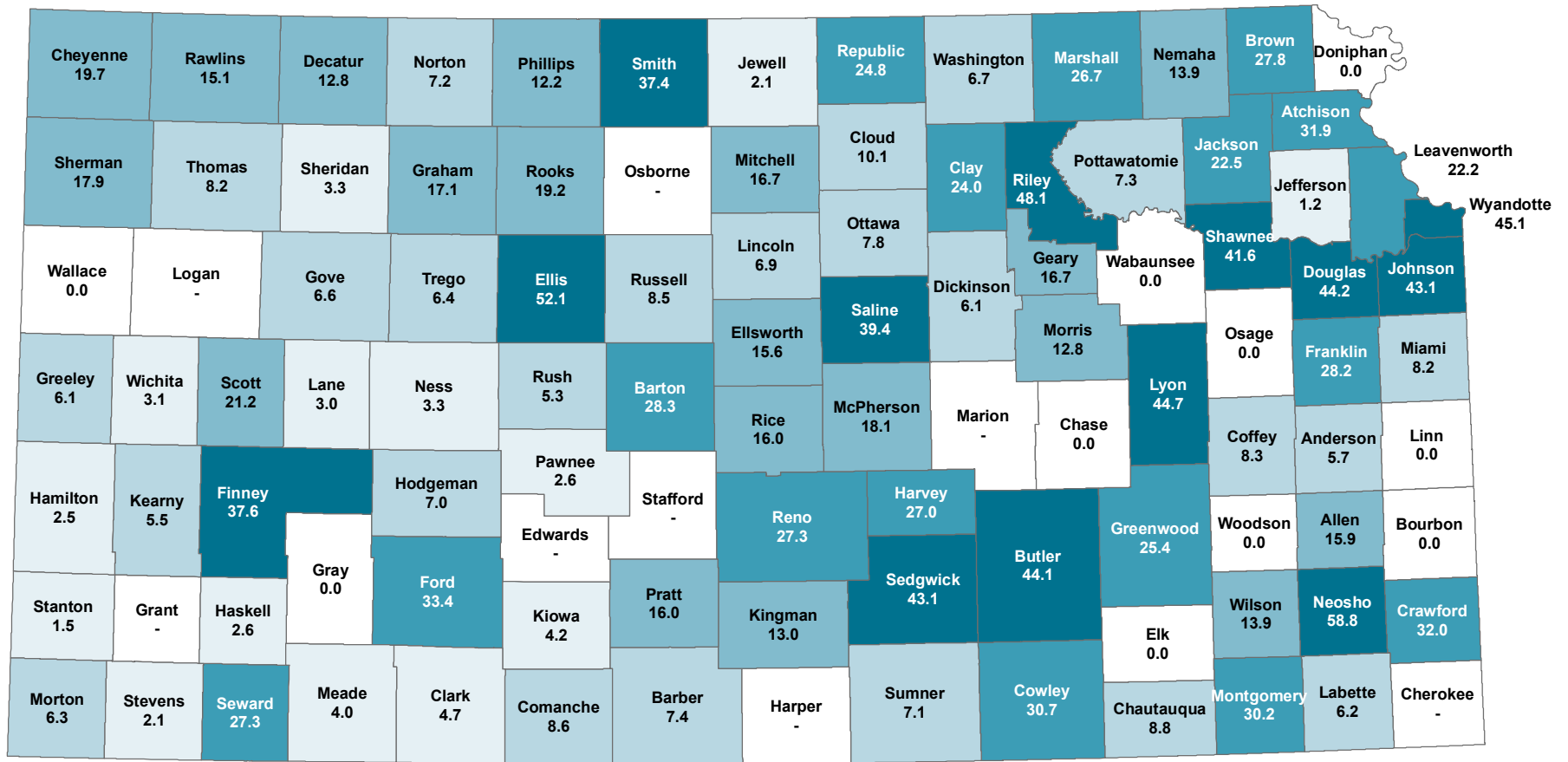

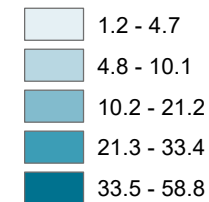
Utilization of Hospitals in Kansas, by County, 2021 Admissions per Bed

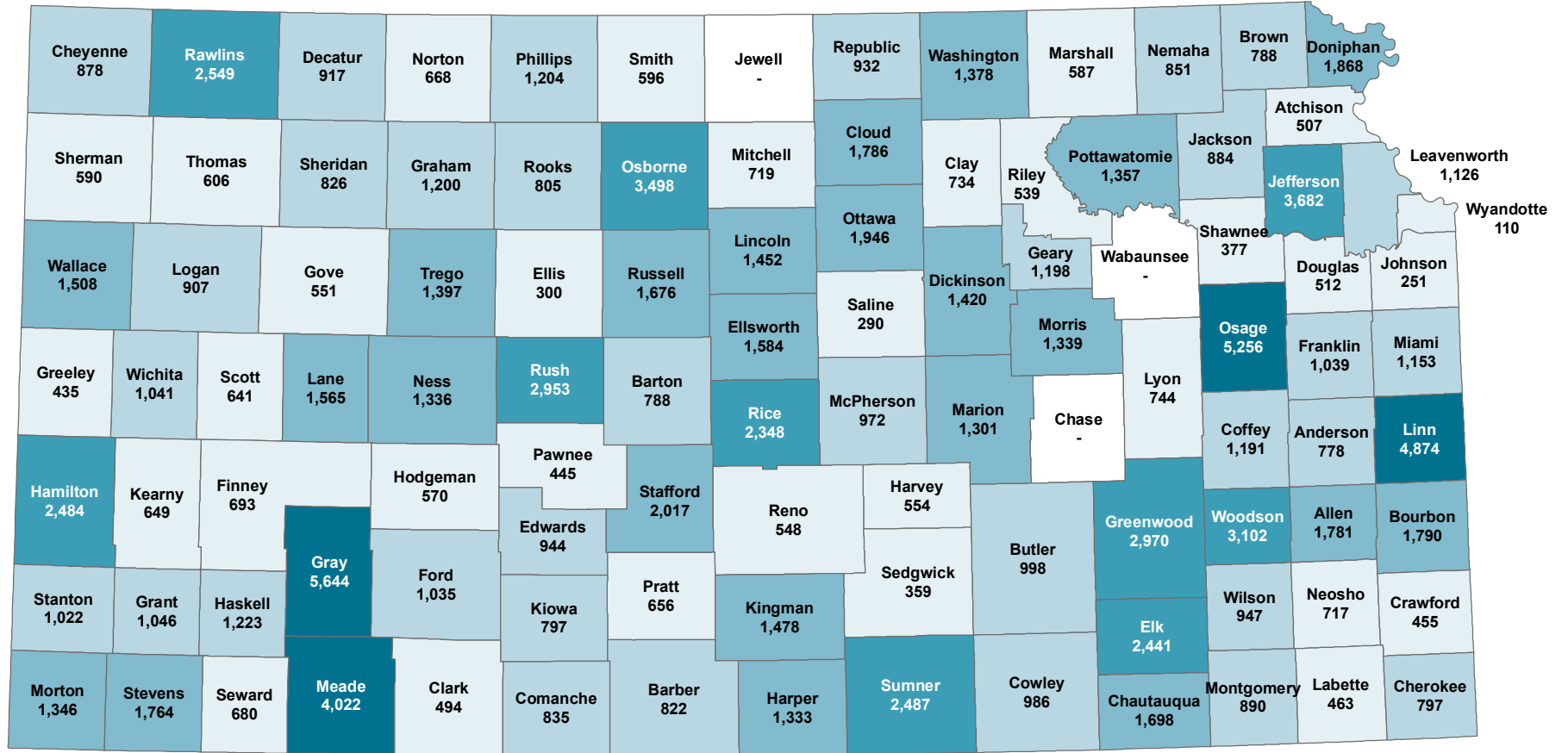

Persons per Physician in Kansas, by County, 2021



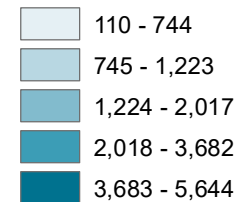

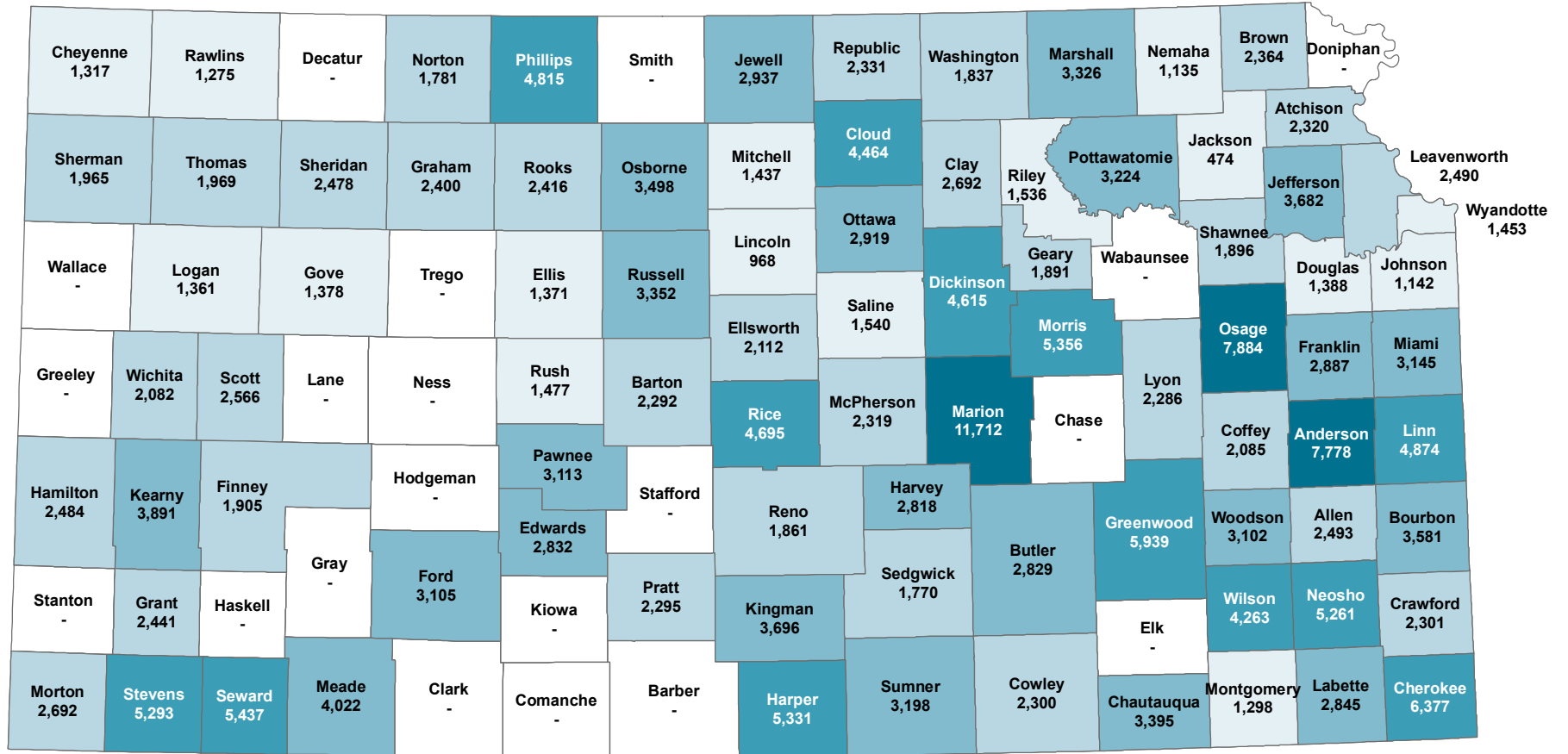

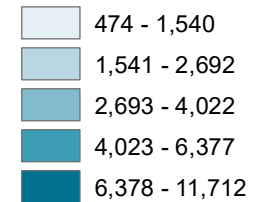
Persons per Dentist in Kansas, by County, 2021

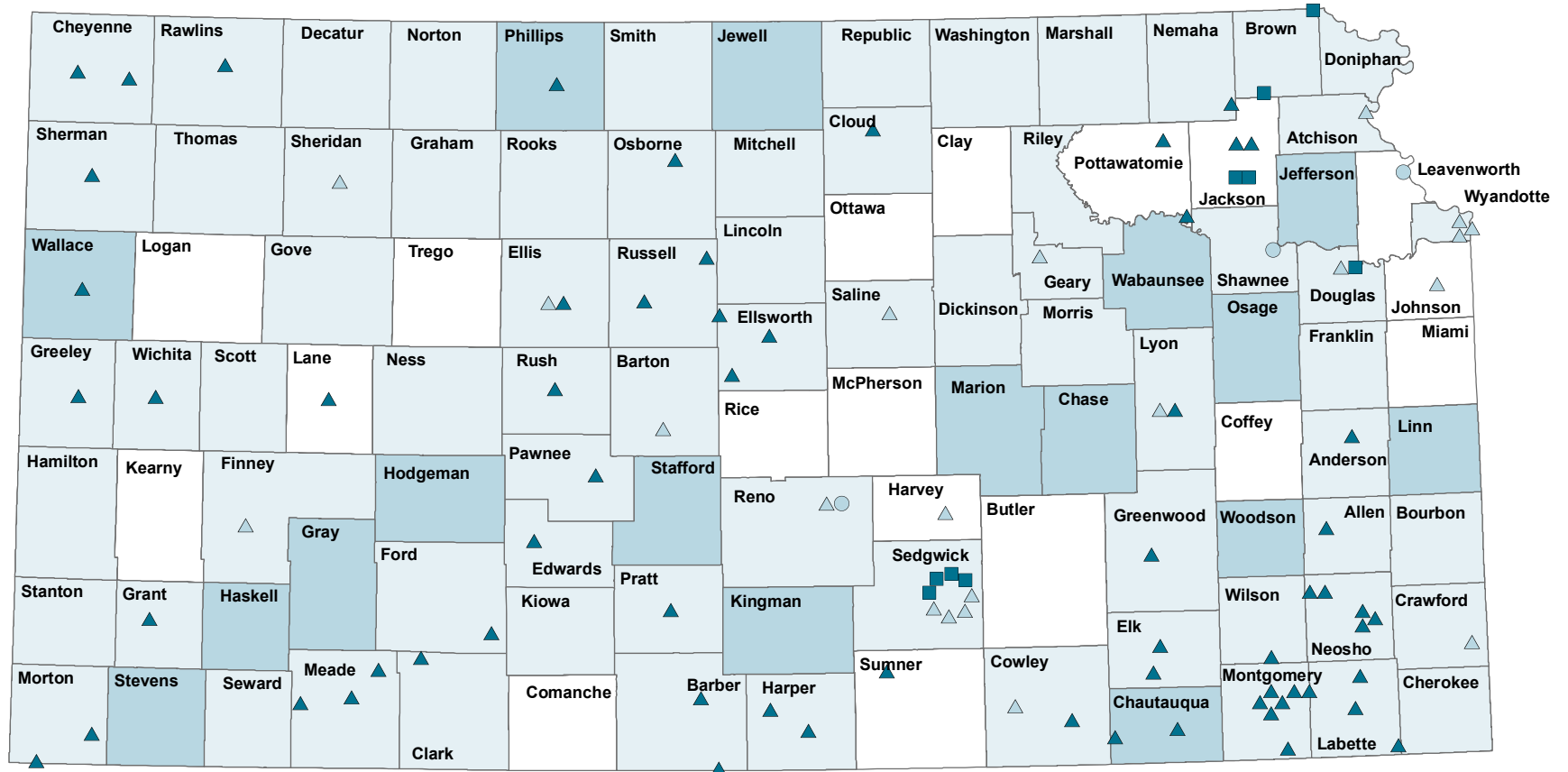

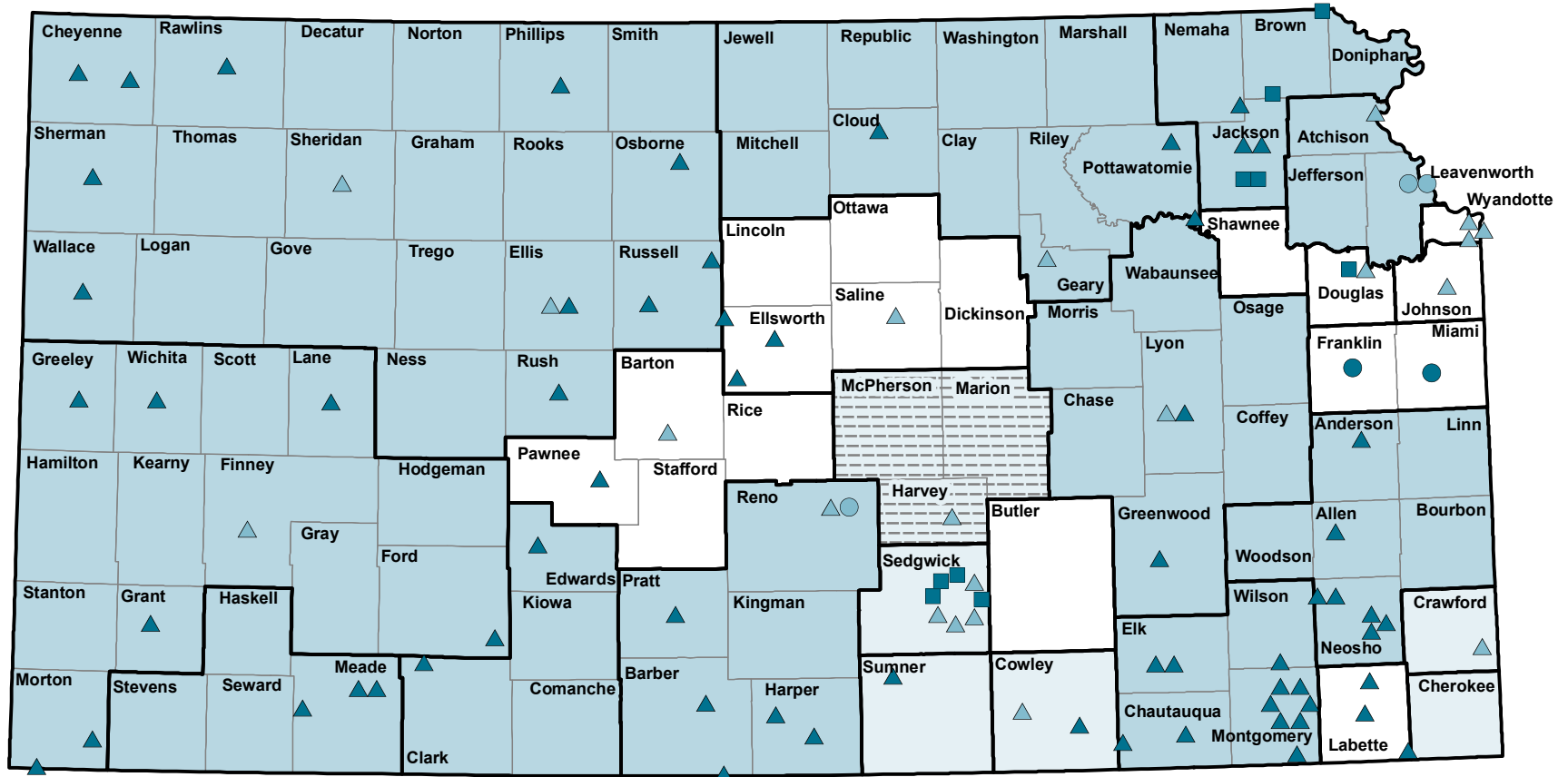

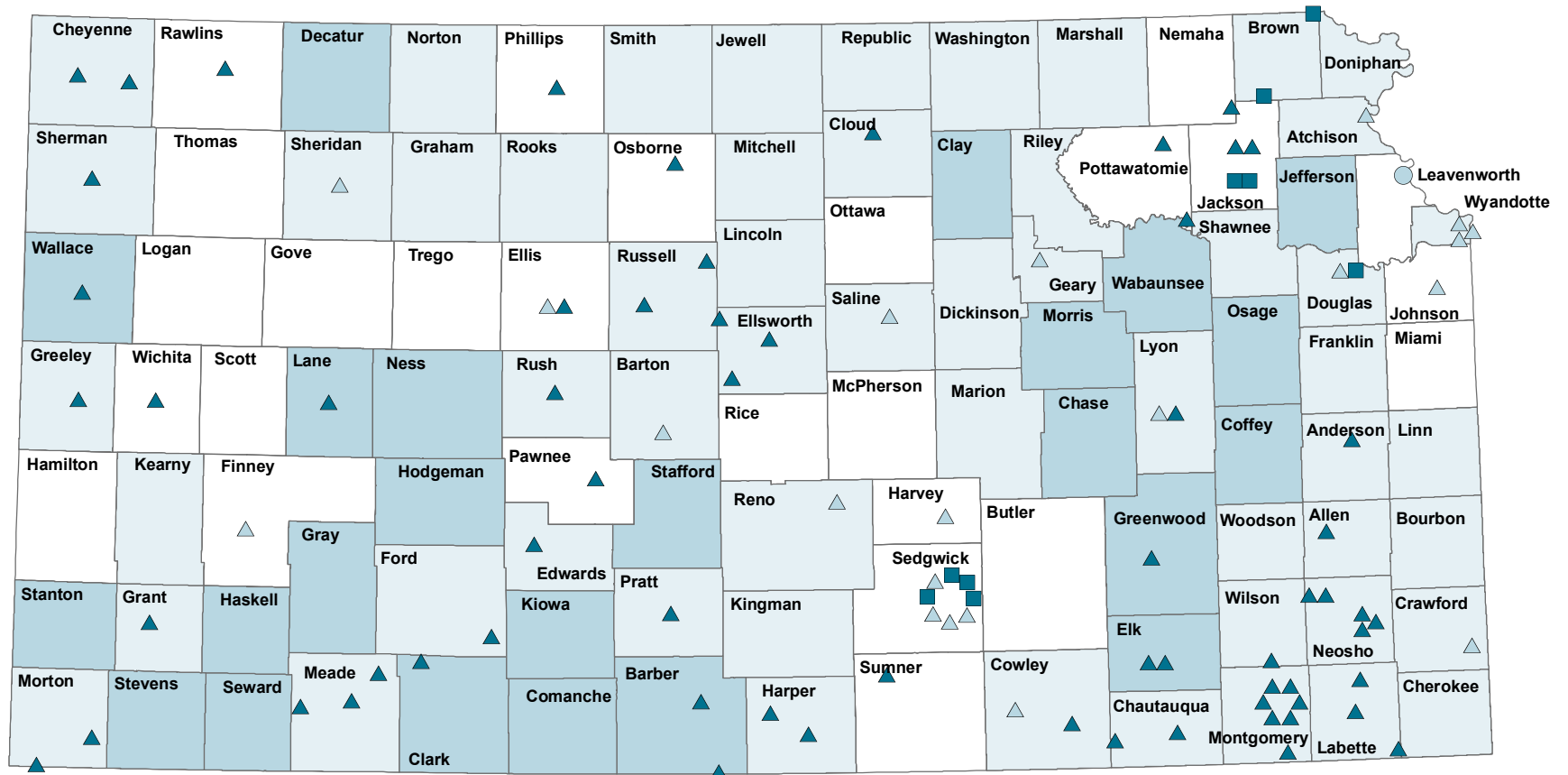

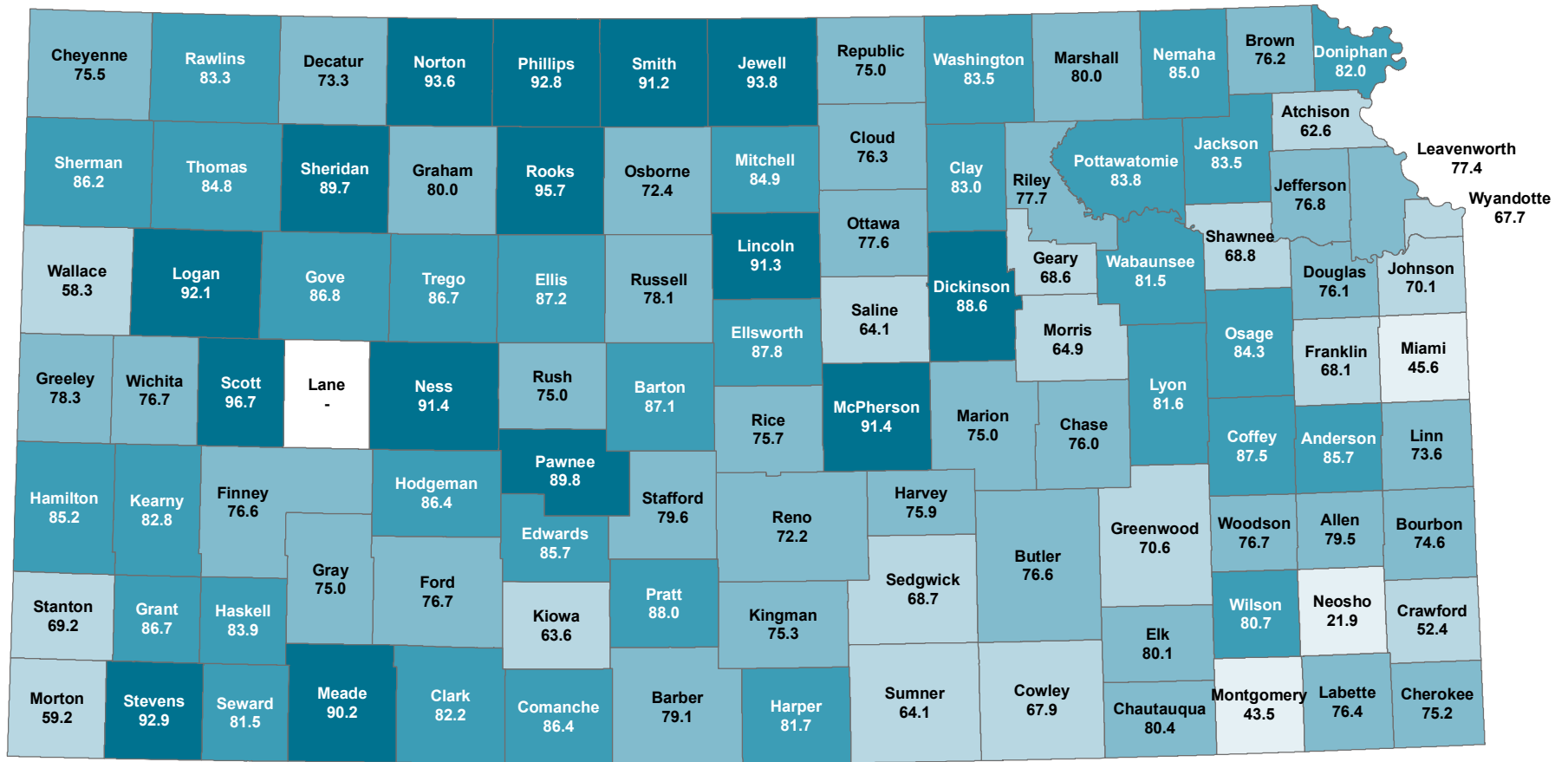

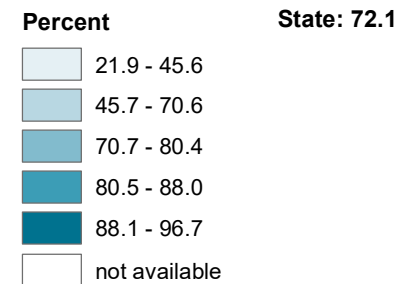

Percent of Infants Fully Immunized at 35 Months in Kansas, by County School Year 2018-19

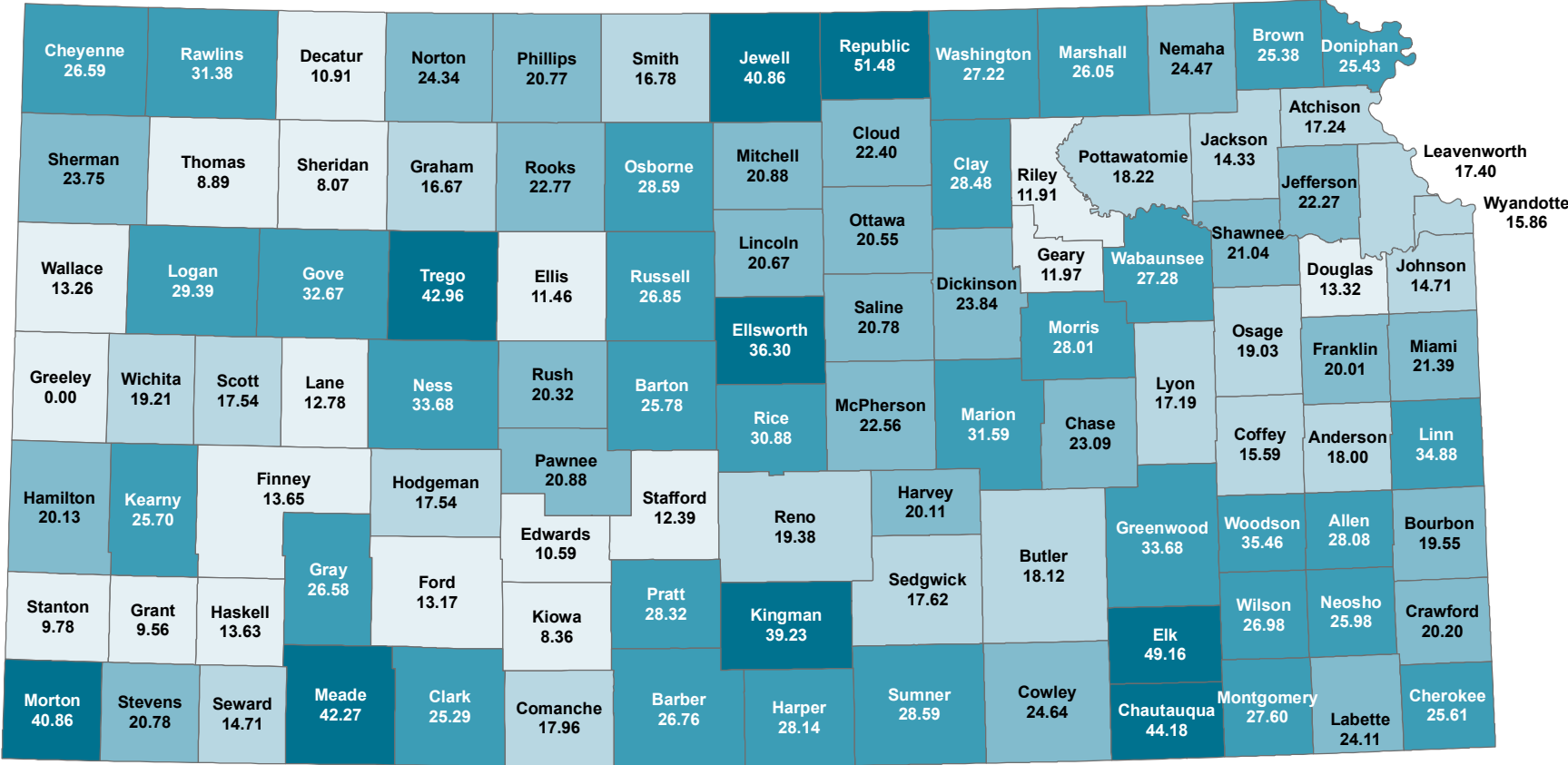

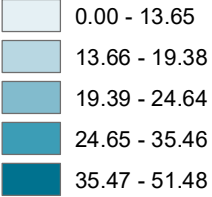


Cancer Death Rates in Kansas per 10,000 People by County of Residence, 2021

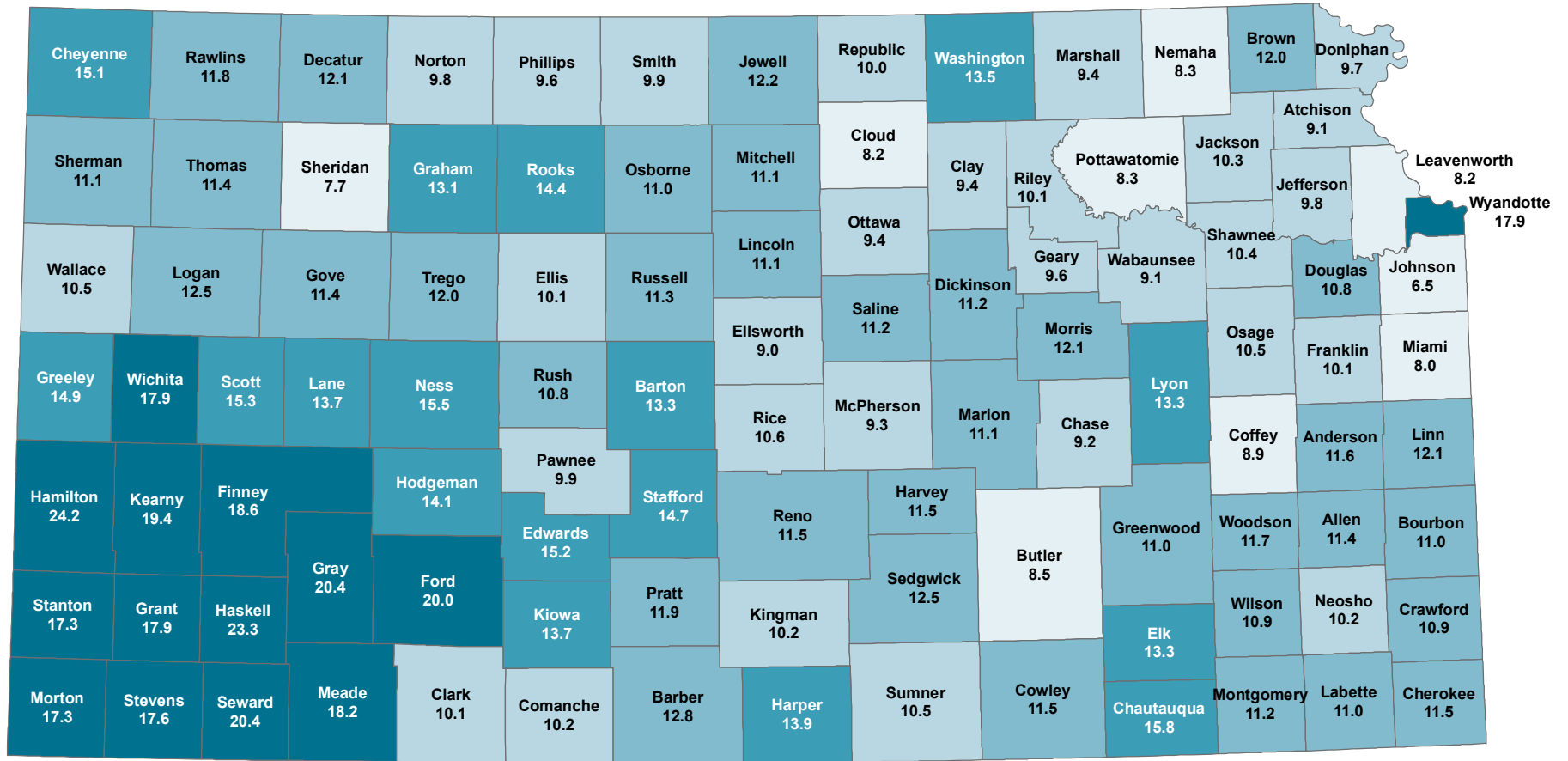

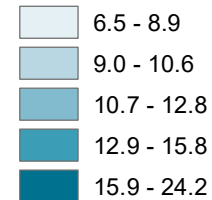

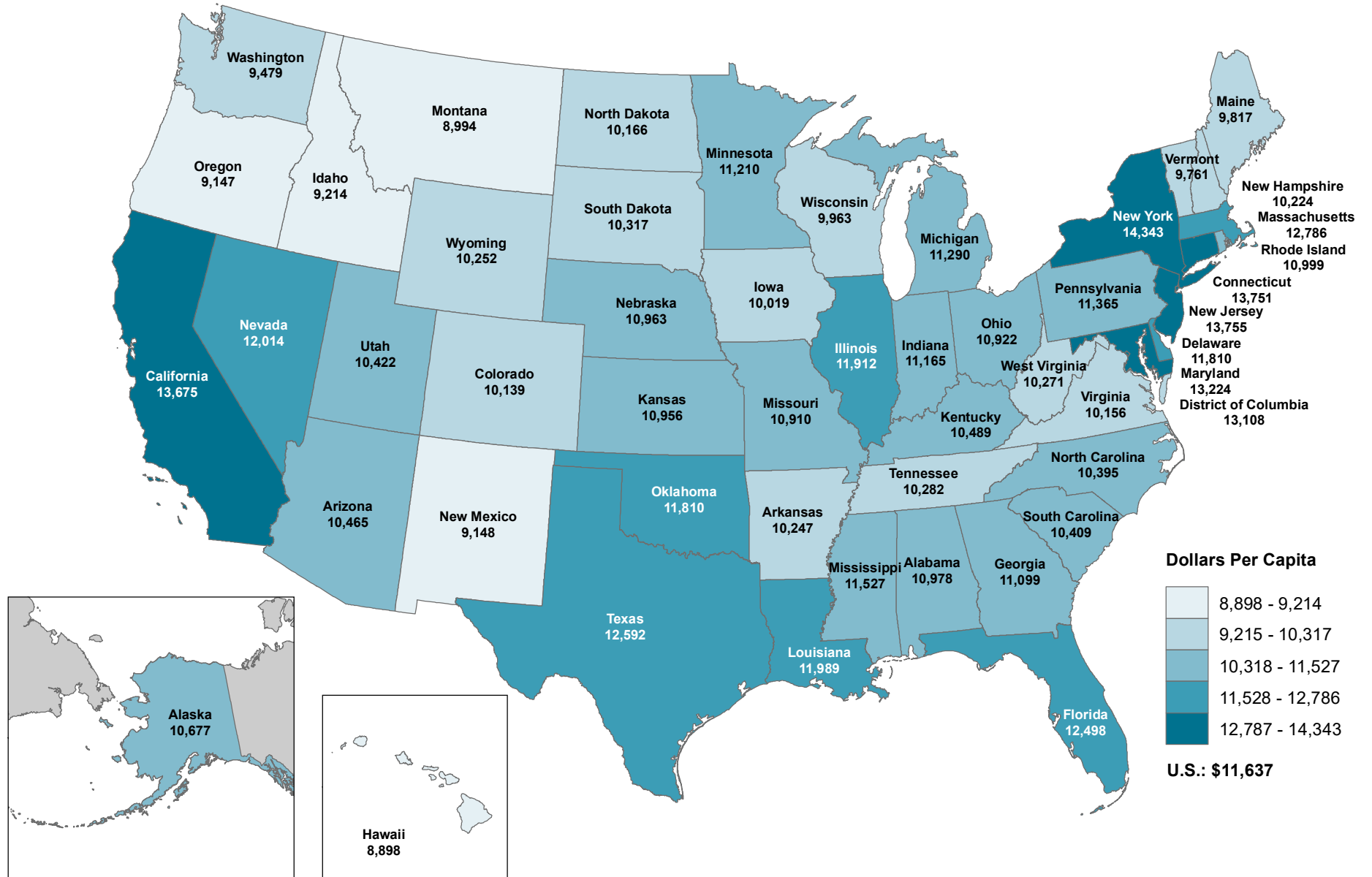

Per Capita Medicare Expenditures in the U.S., by State, 2021



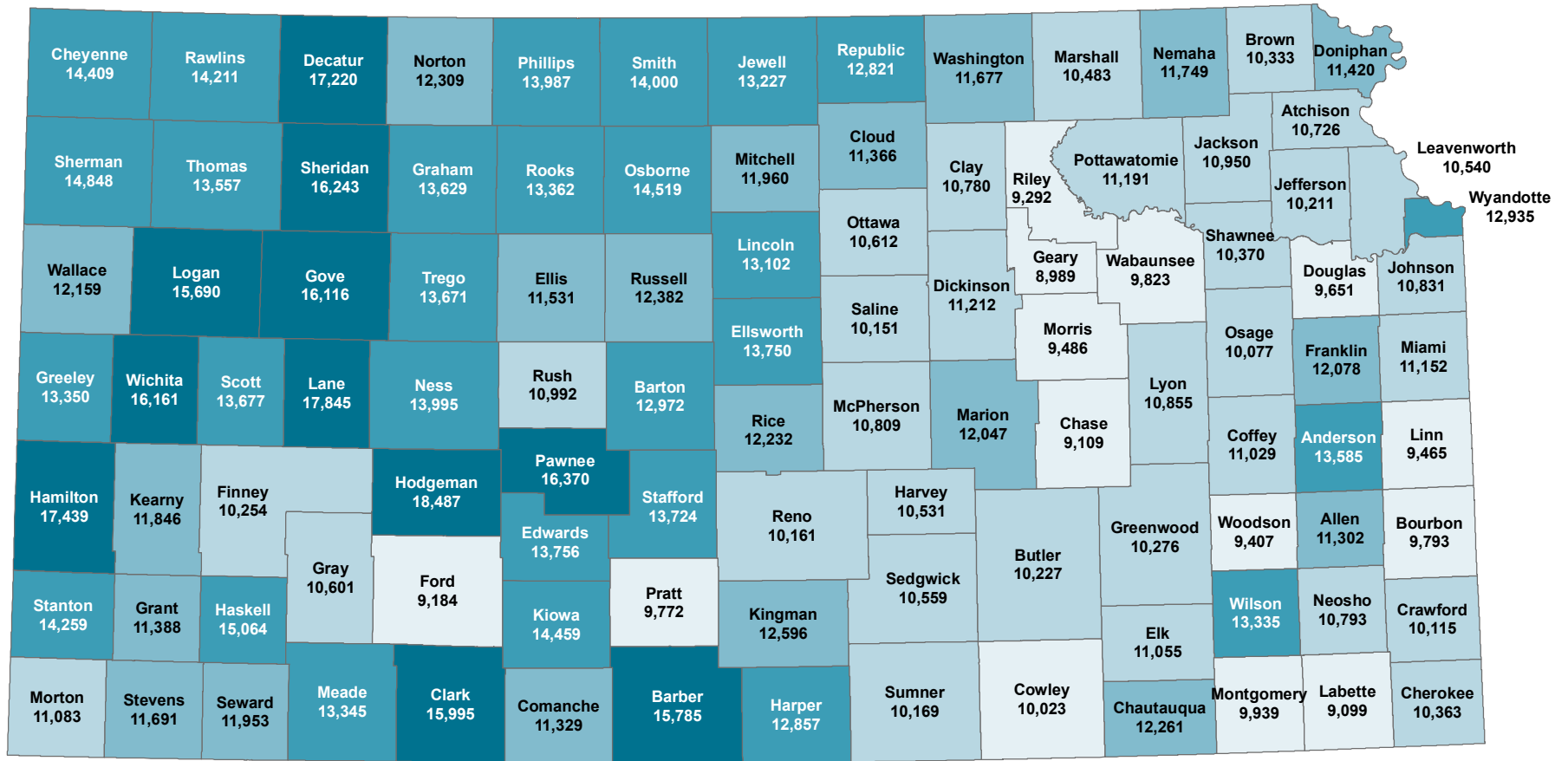

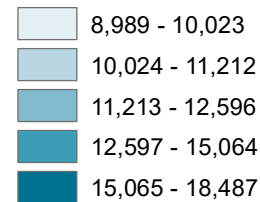
Per Capita Medicare Expenditures in Kansas, by County, 2021



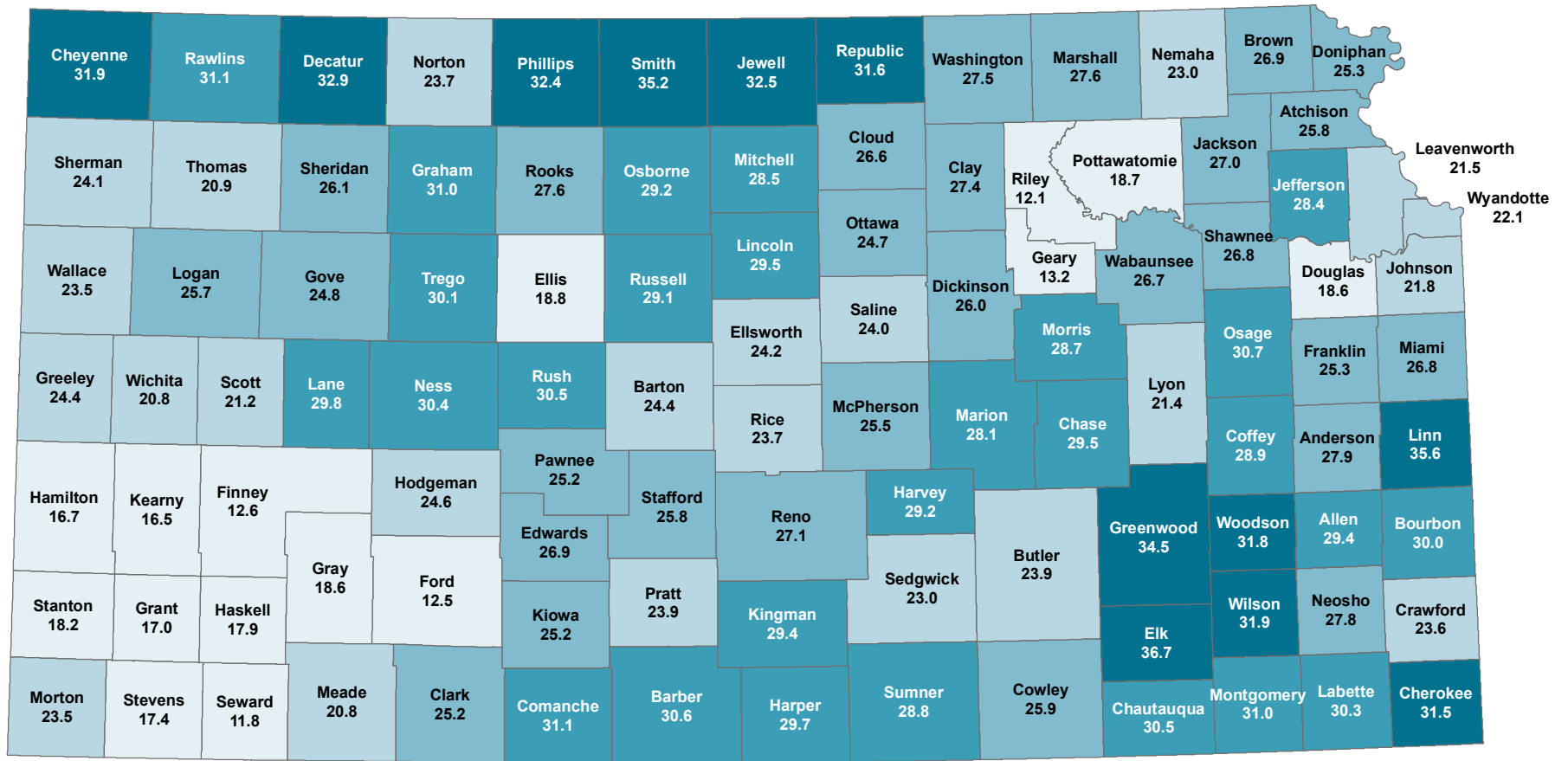

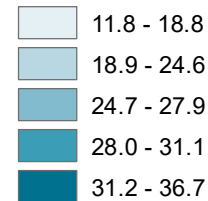
Percent of Population Enrolled in Medicare in Kansas, by County, 2021
