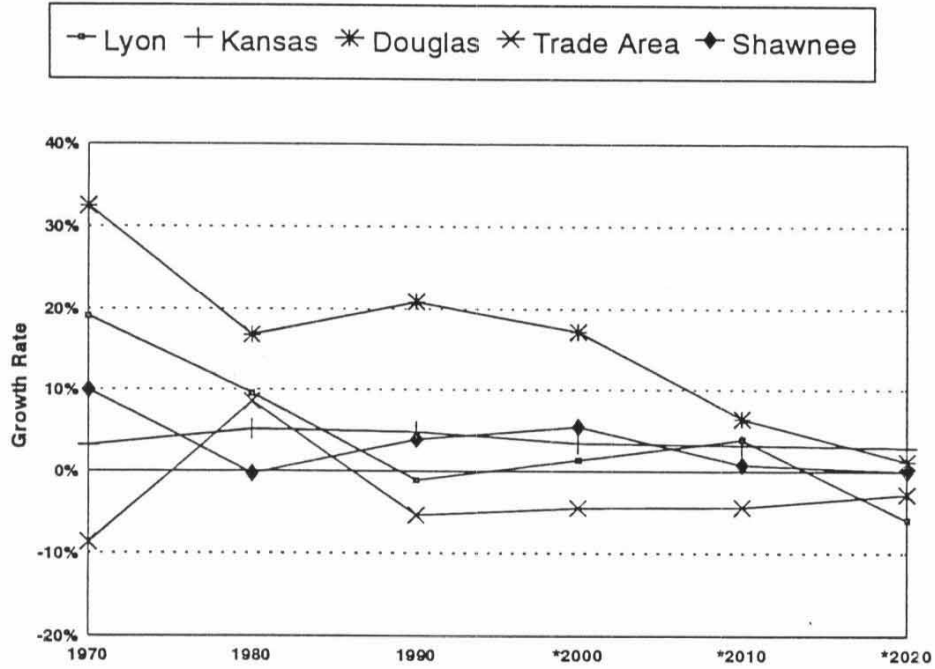

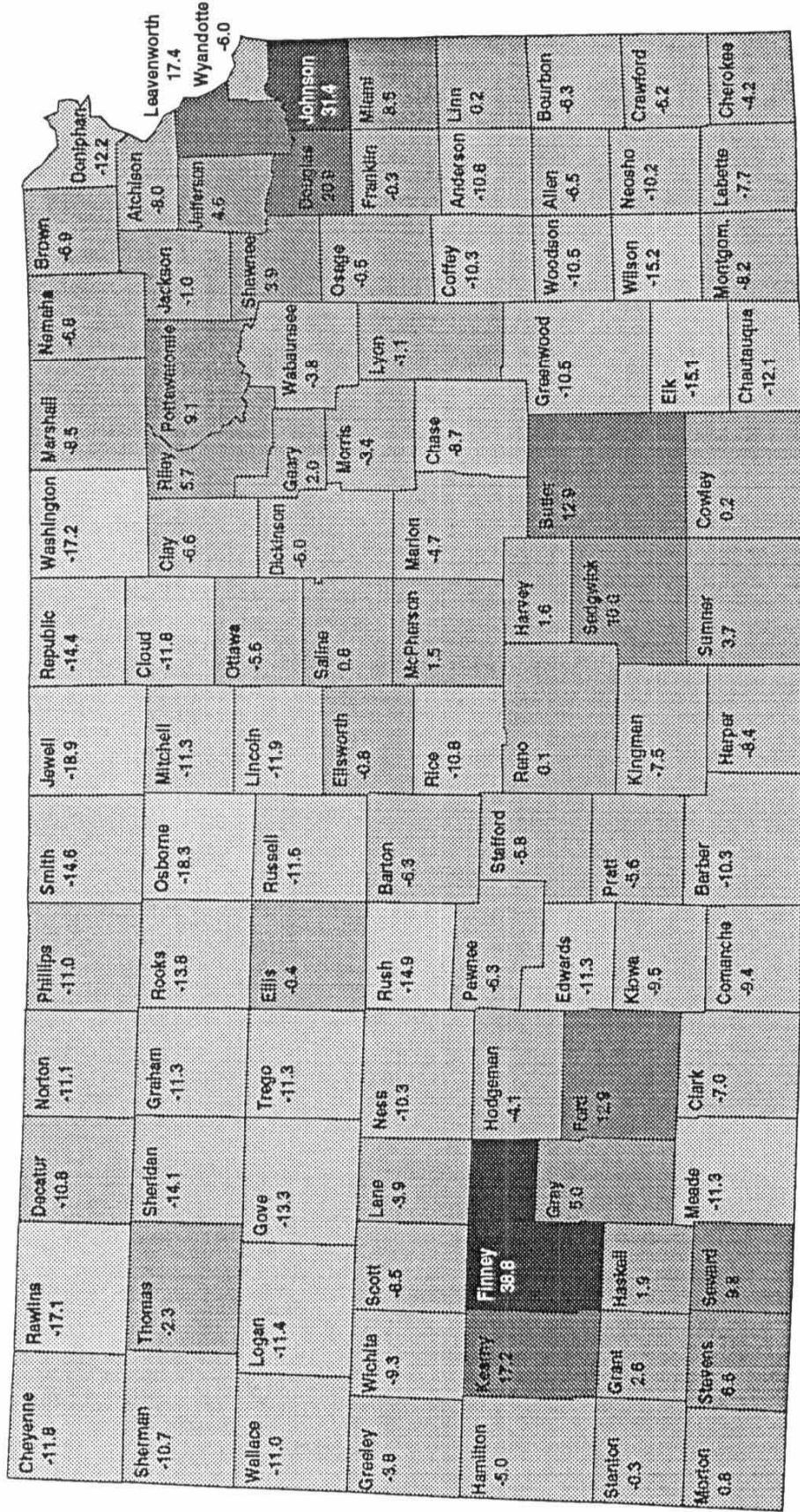

Percent Population Change, 1980 to 1990

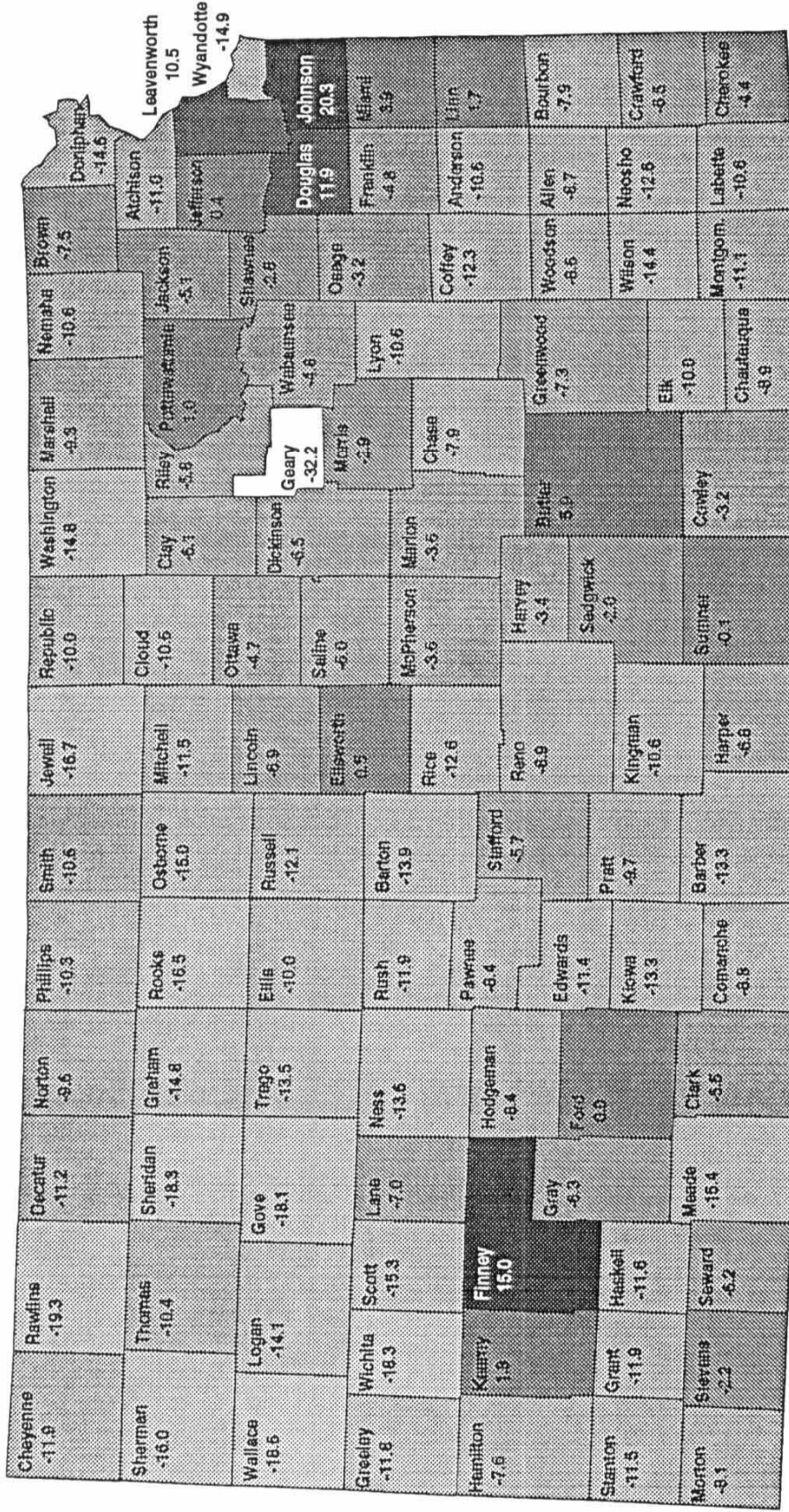

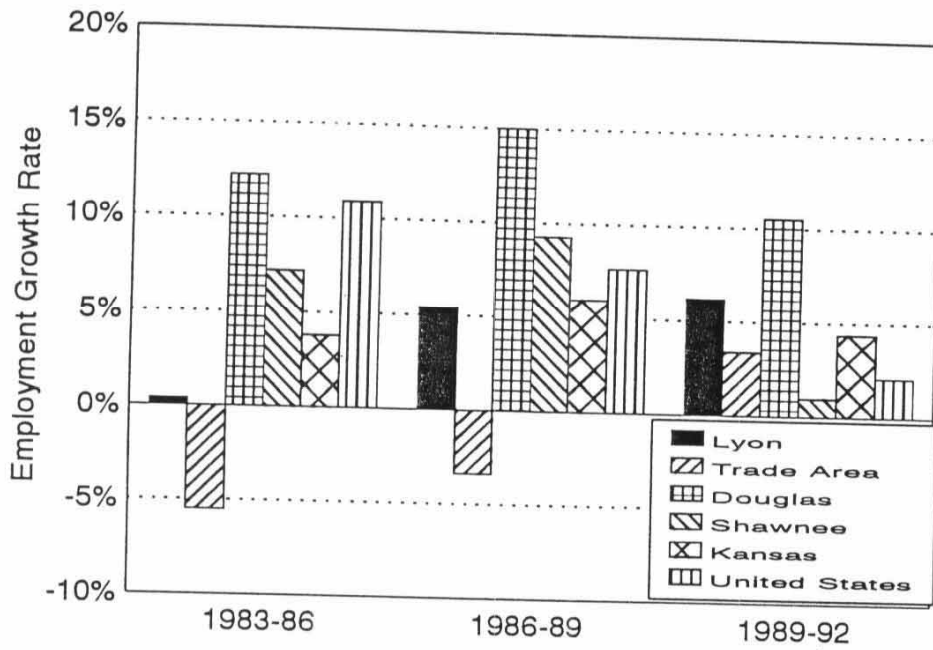

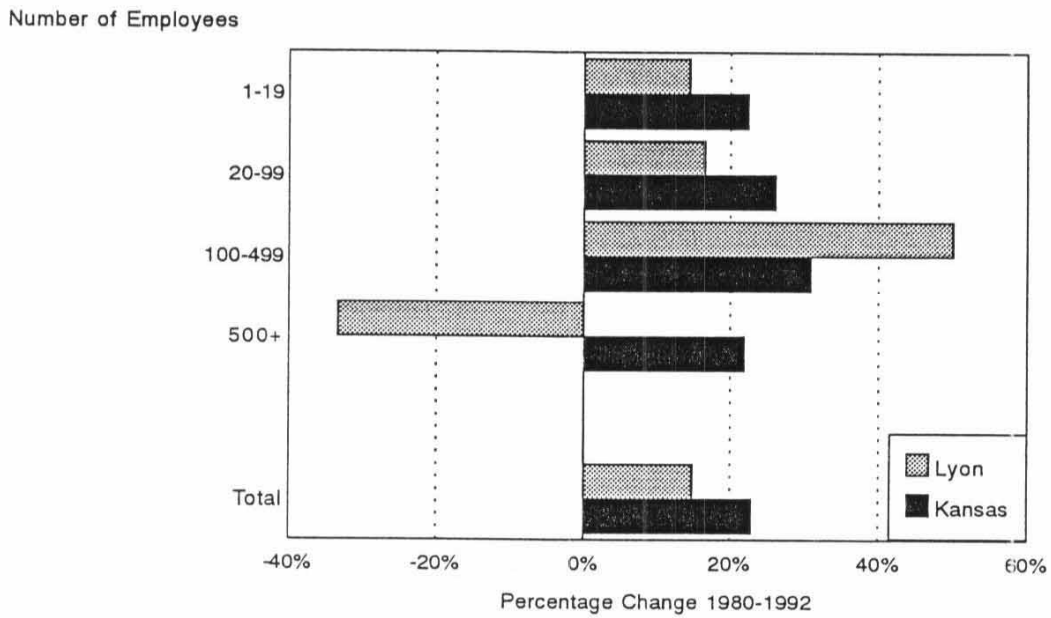

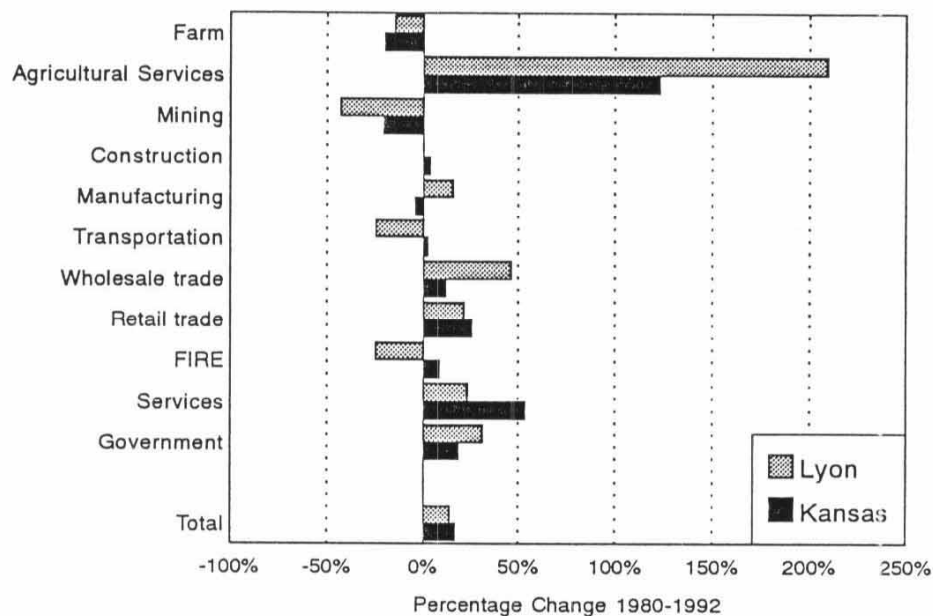

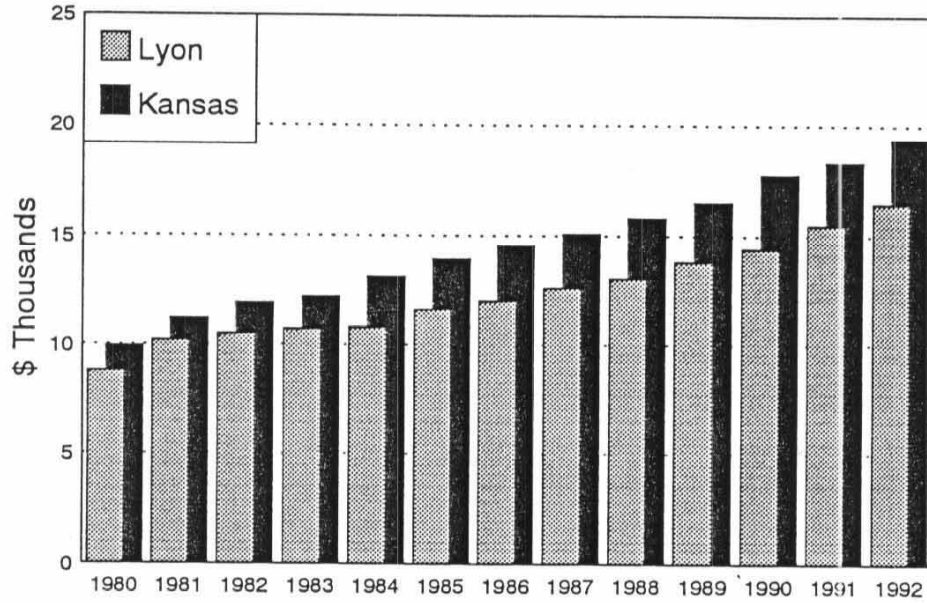
